Rally campers will have free WI-FI, electric (30/50 amp) and water for \$27.00 per night. Showers are included. Cable TV is \$2.00 per night extra.

Please reserve your site by July 1st directly with Red Trail Campground. Mention Airstream group when reserving.

Directions:

From the east (westbound) on I-94:

Take exit 27. Travel about 1-1/2 miles to the Badlands Motel on your right, turn left, cross the RR tracks, travel 1-1/2 blocks to campground.

From the west (eastbound) on I-94:

Take exit 24 ONLY. At the end of the exit ramp turn right and travel about 2 miles to the Badlands Motel on the left side, turn right at that corner, cross the RR tracks and travel 1-1/2 blocks to campground.

Medora is the gateway to Theodore Roosevelt National Park and the North Dakota Badlands. Explore Theodore Roosevelt’s Ranch, North Dakota Cowboy Hall of Fame, and Chateau de Mores State Historic Site. Bike or hike the 97 mile Maah Daah Hey Trail. “Saddle up” and take a trail ride in the Badlands. Golf at the world-class Bully Pulpit golf course. Watch bronco riders at the annual Champions Ride Match Rodeo. Theodore Roosevelt National Park, the North Dakota Badlands, and all activities are located minutes from the rally site.

Medora

Medora was named after the wife of a French nobleman, the Marquis de More, who founded the town in 1883. He had visions of making Medora a cattle empire with a large meat packing plant and other ventures, but his enterprises ended in financial failure in 1886, and he and his family moved back to France.

Also, for a short time, President Theodore Roosevelt spent some important times of his life in Medora. Custer camped here on his way to Montana. Come to Medora to see where the West kicks up its heels and some terrific history was made!

Theodore Roosevelt National Park

Named for the 26th President of the United States, TRNP is managed by the National Park Service and covers 110 square miles of breathtaking vistas in the savagely beautiful North Dakota Badlands.

The South Unit Visitor Center features some of Theodore Roosevelt’s personal items in a museum, as well as other cultural and natural history displays.

The park allows visitors to enjoy panoramic vistas and a sense of solitude, inspiration, and timelessness. A paved, 36-mile loop drive includes interpretive signs that explain the park’s historical and natural features. Bison, prairie dogs, wild horses, mule deer, white-tailed deer, elk, and several species of birds can be viewed in the park.
